




FISHSTICKS DESIGNS SEWN FOR YOU HANGTAGS

These simple to put together hangtags are designed to be placed on items sewn to sell from Fishsticks Designs patterns. For information about sewing to sell from Fishsticks Designs patterns visit www.fishsticksdesigns.com.

To begin, open the Word document that you can find here: <http://www.fishsticksandfries.com/Tutorials/FishsticksDesignsHangTags.doc>. When you open the document, you'll see three columns of three tags for a total of nine per page. To personalize them, simply replace the square with your logo and fill in your website link right under.



Once you have your page set up properly, print on cardstock using your home printer. (Feel free to send this off to your local print shop, if you'd like for someone else to do the printing and cutting for you.) Here's what your sheet should look like when it's printed:




Next grab your paper-cutter and start cutting the tags apart. The margins and columns are set up so that if you cut down the center of each row, the tags will be equal widths with equal margins on each side. When cutting the tops and bottoms, you want about 1/2" on top and just a sliver of margin on the bottom. Once your tags are cut apart, use your single hole punch to punch a hole on the top of each tag. The center point is right over the "or" in the word for.



Now you're ready to add a loop tie to hang your tags. I used scrap pieces of yarn since that is what I had on hand. I started with yarn pieces cut about 12" long. I folded each one half, inserted the folded end through the hole in each tag, pushed the cut ends through the loop formed by the folded end of the yarn and pulled tight.





Tie the two loose ends in a knot, leaving about 3" on each end. Finally, tie the 3" loose ends in a bow.



Using a tiny safety pin, attach the bow to your item of clothing and you're all set to sell!



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
